Through our American Job Center locations in Hartford, New Britain, Enfield and Manchester, the organizations drives to close the skills gap between job seekers and employers. Capital Workforce Partners is one of five Workforce Development Boards that evolved as part of the Workforce Investment Act of 1998, which was reauthorized in July 2014 as the Workforce Innovation and Investment Act.

As a private, non-profit 501(c)(3) corporation Capital Workforce Partners coordinates programs and initiatives to develop a skilled, educated and vital workforce. Capital Workforce Partners:

- Promotes and invests in youth and future workforce solutions
- Identifies and supports development of sustainable career paths for adult workers
